Throughout each of the classrooms and across several tables, caring busy work was done while caring, concerned conversations were held amongst our Blooming Grove family: voicing concerns about getting crops in... and the weather challenges; expressing awareness of heavy, dangerous machinery and long, long hours in the fields well beyond the darkest of night; sharing the worries and burdens of health concerns amongst our BG family and beyond, and of family concerns or financial dilemmas. And yet also expressing the joy of being part of this BG family, working together, celebrating big and little happenings, not the least of which is the joyful spark Pastor Kathy and Jerry have ignited in our midst; and celebrating that we have such an abundance of richness in our lives that we eagerly tie knots to enfold this richness, warmth, and love with whomever the recipient of any of the completed beautiful (and each unique) blankets might be. [You may notice in the photos that the youngest nimble fingers took a wee bitsy play-time break!) 2nd Sunday – Funday!, in a way, is a worship service in itself. If you've not yet experienced a 2nd Sunday – Funday!, please consider joining us on Sunday November 10th for another of our *intergenera*tional events. We're postponing our originally scheduled "BG Believe It Or Not" event, in lieu of more blanket making. The 8 colorful blankets completed in October were gratefully received by District One Hospital Emergency Dept. staff, (after sending the blankets through our membership on Sunday to 'load 'em up' with prayers that will envelope each recipient). They had run out of the blankets which they give to youngsters going

through a frightening experience and to lonely/ alone adults and seniors who find themselves in an ER and who have no family, neighbors or others to be with them as they undergo tests and treatments.




Just like fingerprints, each one is uniquely different.

Bid-Taking

In most cases, we requested 2-3 bids per type of work in order to make a good faith effort in comparing ideas and quality of work, as well as price. Please note that our local contractors are facing the same timing concerns as our area farmers this year. The wet and late spring, combined with a wet summer, have put them behind in all of their scheduled work, for which they want to honor their commitments of completing before winter. As a result, their "bid work" is a little delayed, and often needs to wait for a rainy day. We have asked for all bids to be submitted by November 1st. Our building project team will meet in November to review the bids and create a final projected project cost.

Request for Prayer

- Gather final bids and brainstorm our way through a multitude of excellent questions from the contractors.
- Modify building plans per contractor questions and suggestions gathered along the way.

- ◆ Obtain approval from the MN Conference of the UMC District Board of Church and Building.
- Explore grants and outside funding.
- Contact all members and friends of BGUMC to invite support of the project and to gather estimates of giving toward the project.
