

Embracing Ordinary

When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus.

Acts 4:13 NIV

As usual, the Visitor staff is waiting for me to get my article to them. I arrived home from our Minnesota Annual Conference last evening—too tired and too late to do justice to this June offering. June! June 5th (our first Sunday in June 2022) is Pentecost Sunday and Holy Communion. It is the day we celebrate our graduates in our Waterville and Janesville churches. It is also the first Sunday of our worship time change between our Blooming Grove and Janesville congregations. Boredom will not be an issue on our first Sunday in June. So, we look forward to the following Sundays understanding that after Pentecost, we move into Ordinary Time in our church liturgical year.

Friends, these are days of everything that is outside of my perception of ordinary. As we started the business of the church on our Annual Conference's first day, Bishop Bard stopped the proceeding to tell those gathered that there had been another school shooting. As we were led in prayer, my heavy heart kept beating when so many innocent hearts were no longer sustaining life. There is nothing ordinary about children and their teacher being murdered in a place where they should be safe. On the final day of conference, we moved into plenary to continue voting on items brought before the church body. I felt so profoundly sad to vote yes on churches choosing to disaffiliate from our United Methodist family citing irreconcilable differences. There is nothing ordinary about seeing the division in our denomination.

I confess. I am looking for ordinary these days. In the text from Acts 4:13, we hear of those who saw "ordinary men"—Peter and John—and were astonished by their courage, so much so that they took note that the men had been with Jesus. In these days of everything but ordinary, it is my prayer that you and I embrace the kind of ordinary of Peter and John. Let us embrace Jesus as we look for the courage needed in these times. Please God, in your mercy, let it be so!


We had a lot to celebrate on Sunday May 15th. Three young people in our church family are receiving graduation diplomas, and that's truly an accomplishment worth recognizing.


Private burial was held at Immanuel United Methodist Cemetery in Blooming Grove Township, Waseca County.


