Love Offering Thanks!

Thank you to all from BGUMC who donated to the Love Offering in May, raising a total of \$410! Our gifts were brought to our MN United Methodist Annual Conference gathering and pooled with Love Offering donations from United Methodist Churches around the state, for a grand total of more than \$103,000. Amazing! This year's Love Offering will be divided in 4 ways: 30% will go to a new trauma care center in Ukraine, 30% will go to immigration legal support in partnership with Volunteer Lawyer Network, 30% will go to special programming aimed at reducing trauma at Emma Norton Services' new Restoring Waters facility, and 10% will go to Volunteers in Mission scholarships, which support first-time mission trip participants.

At Tuesday's Clergy Session of this year's MN United Methodist Annual Conference gathering (May 28th – May 30th in Bloomington), Pastor Kathy was officially approved by all voting clergy to become an Associate Member of the MN Conference of the UMC. At Wednesday evening's Celebration of Life as Clergy Worship Service, held at Hennepin Avenue United Methodist Church (Minneapolis), Bishop Lanette Plambeck publicly recognized and blessed Pastor as an Associate Member. Pastor Kathy is one of only two local licensed pastors who have completed the work to become Associate Members in the Minnesota Conference! As an Associate Member, Pastor Kathy is now responsible to the Bishop, rather than the Board of Ordained Ministry. In addition, Pastor Kathy now retains her ministry credentials for her lifetime, rather than losing them at retirement, and no longer needs to undergo an annual licensing process.

Becoming an Associate Member is a long and diligent journey. It is open to persons who begin their ministry as a local licensed pastor, have served in that capacity for a number of years, and who demonstrate a track record of highly effective service, accomplishments, and ministerial attributes in their role as clergy. The journey to Associate Membership includes the steps listed below.

- Completion of a multi-year Course of Study Program with, or approved by, a United Methodist Seminary. (Pastor Kathy chose the Native American Course of Study.)
- Application to, and approval by, the MN UMC Board of Ordained Ministry to become a candidate for Associate Member.
- Completion of all requirements, interviews, and reviews of the MN UMC Board of Ordained Ministry.
- Approval by the MN UMC Board of Ordained Ministry.
- Vote of approval by the Clergy session of the MN UMC Annual Conference.

We share with you here a note of blessing to Pastor Kathy from Rev. Dr. Fred Vanderwerf, our former UMC District Superintendent, and Pastor Kathy's sponsor on her journey to Associate Membership. (Note: In 2019, Fred brought Pastor Kathy, and her ministry, into our midst.)

Kathy - You are nailin' it! Knockin' this ministry journey out of the park. I'm so blessed to be in the service of Christ together with you. I so appreciate your positive hope-filled spirit – rain or shine! You speak goodness into people, but not just any goodness – God's tremendous goodness. Congratulations on Associate Membership and kudos to you for effective leadership as a pastor, preacher, and planter.

Review of January 2024 meeting: approved by consensus

Financial Reports:

- Treasurer's Report: Brad Saufferer will wait a couple more weeks to send our donation to the Bethlehem Inn until the blessing of the blankets. We have the bill for the plumbing repairs in the kitchen, but not the electrician yet. Brian moved to accept the report, seconded by Patti motion carried.
- Financial Secretary Report: The men's breakfast raised \$1345 for the drain project. The income from the fish fry went to the building fund. Brad Saufferer moved to accept, seconded by Judy motion carried.

Trustees Report:

- Basement Drain Solution The kitchen drains are fixed; still waiting for electrician's bill.
- Other Trustee Updates Brad put in a call to Owatonna Glass about the round storm window (it's cracked), but no one has called him back. Kirchner's will replace it if we get a window to install. We may have someone who can fabricate a cart for the tables and chairs. They are looking into blocking a couple of windows to keep mice out. New flags are flying on the flagpole. Brad Spinler has lined up someone out of Waseca to mow the lawn. They were looking for a church to mow to build their resume.

Old Business

- The new filing cabinet and shelves for the back room are here. Hasn't been time to deal with them yet.
- The building loan is due 10/15/2025. The finance committee met and plan to pay some extra in every month in order to be down under \$100,000 by the due date.

• Patti wondered if we should suspend this committee. They haven't met for ages. She is willing to act as Youth Coordinator.

PPRC

- Met last night. They discussed the continuing ed for CONAM meeting in Anchorage, AK October 13-18.
 Patti moved to allow Pastor Kathy to tap travel and continuing ed funds to make the trip. Brian seconded – motion carried.
- Pastor Kathy will be gone May 6-12 for Alexia's graduation. Deb Miller will lead worship on May 12th.
- May 5th is Poppy Nicholson's confirmation.

Communication

• The new directory is done. Chery has a spreadsheet with everyone's information.

- Lent/Easter services and activities.
- People loved the Good Friday service here.

• Cindy reported that the District Day Apart will be here on June 11th. She is awaiting instructions. We will be responsible for providing lunch; they do the program. Judy will be the musician. Highlights from the 2024 Annual Conference of the MN United Methodist Church May 28th – 30th in Bloomington, MN

Theme: Drawing from Isaiah 43:1, the theme of this year's Annual Conference is "Jesus. Redeemer." We gathered to be reminded what it means to be named and claimed by Jesus for the sake of our mission. We explored how to live together, anchored in our identity as Christ followers who are inspired to live with hope, possibility, and purpose.

Bishop's Episcopal Address: On a trip to Scotland in 2019, while Bishop Lanette was stepping onto a bus, the driver instructed her to "mind the gap" between the platform and the vehicle. "I believe God has uniquely positioned the United Methodist Church in Minnesota to be trailblazers as we mind the gaps of society," she said. We can mind the gap of justice and reconciliation work. We can mind the gap of the least of these so that people will have their basic human needs met. It is up to us to mind the gap that separates the kingdom of heaven from what we are experiencing here on earth.

Milestones in ministry: At a beautiful worship service at Hennepin Avenue UMC in Minneapolis, Minnesota United Methodists honored and thanked 14 clergy entering retirement, and they celebrated one pastor ordained as a deacon, three commissioned as provisional members, one recognized as a provisional member from another denomination, one recognized as an associate member, and six authorized to serve as local pastors in the congregations and ministry areas in which they are appointed.

Staying power: In a powerful sermon based on Isaiah 43:1-2, Rev. Cindy Gregorson pointed out that God tells us not to be afraid not if—but *when*—we encounter deep waters or raging rivers, or walk through fire. God knows how scary it can be when our world starts shifting, and the tug between the comfortable and the unknown



happens to all of us all the time. If we are going to be able to go the distance, we need to stay in love with God because that is where our staying power comes from, she said. She told those gathered: "You are called. You are beloved. You are precious in God's sight. You can do this hard thing, whatever your hard thing is, because you are not doing it alone. God is with you, God is for you, God has got you."

Living into our baptismal vows: As this year's Conference Preacher, Rev. Luke Nelson delivered a sermon urging us to live into our baptismal vows. He reminded attendees that they created in the image and likeness of God, and that God claims us and is with us, always. We are set aside for one sacred purpose: to share God's love with the world. But we don't do it alone; we are in this together. He reminded those gathered that when we are baptized, our congregations also vow to be a community of love and forgiveness for us. "United Methodism is a feast entrusted to us not only to set the table for the world, but for you to taste and see that the Lord is good," he said.

Legislation: Hundreds of voting members in attendance at Annual Conference approved the majority of legislation under consideration, including:

- · moving from five to four districts as of July 1, 2024.
- · a resolution that denounces the increase in hate crimes in the U.S., calls on the Minnesota Conference to partner with others on this concern, and calls on Minnesota congregations to commit to actions to increase learning and speak out.
- · a resolution that opposes Israeli apartheid, calls on the U.S. government to make U.S. funding conditional upon Israel dismantling its apartheid system, and urges United Methodists to listen to Palestinian voices.
- the establishment of a conference Board of Lay Ministry to equip and enable lay persons to be in mission and ministry in all aspects of life.


