Camp Chaos Celebrating God's Wild & Wonderful Creation!


A Day of Learning, Fun, and Wonder



At this event, kids and adults of all ages work together to hand-pack **nutritious MannaPack** Rice **meals** specifically designed to assist in reversing and preventing undernutrition, with each meal costing less than 30 cents. Note: There are also "seated volunteer" positions available – placing labels on rice bags waiting to be packed.

FMSC, a Christian nonprofit organization, partners with organizations around the world to reach undernourished children. They donate meals, free of cost, to an exceptional network of schools, orphanages, medical clinics, and feeding programs in 70 countries around the world – helping to deliver hope, and break the cycle of poverty. Eating just one of these meals a day can save a child's life.

Grief and Love

Yesterday morning, I pulled myself out of bed looking for my first cup of coffee to sit, enjoy, wake-up and watch the news. I might have been grumbling to myself about watching the local news because it would be all about the State Fair. The second week in, I have lost interest in hearing about all the tasty tidbits being sold at the fair. As I sat, a breaking news report came in telling the known details of the school shooting at Annunciation Catholic School in south Minneapolis. Tiny pieces of my heart were streaming down my face. At that moment, what I would have given for a story about deep-fried anything.

So many of us are carrying a quiet grief right now. We feel it in the news, in conversations that break down, in the polarization of our politics, as another wildfire burns, another child is harmed.

This grief can be overwhelming if I let it in. I fear it could even break me. It is in these moments that I return to a quote from Joanna Macy, a Buddhist teacher who says this: "Our pain for the world is simply one side of the coin, and the other side is our love for the world. They co-arise." Her words tell us that the grief we carry is not weakness but love in its fiercest, most honest form.

Our grief isn't because we are broken but because we care. Somewhere deep within us, we know that this is not how the world is meant to be. This ache is holy. It's not something to push away or numb or fix. It is the heart's natural response to a world out of balance and that we have not forgotten how to love.

This love is being lived out within our Blooming Grove community and parish. I experienced hope during Camp Chaos as we explored caring for creation and money collected for flood victims of Texas. We will welcome walkers and runners as they help support the local food shelves and collect winter coats and gear for the residents of Restoring Waters.

Let's not turn away from the hurt, let it lead us to what matters most. In the face of suffering, we can show up with open hands and steady hearts. May we live as if love is our deepest truth.
