





A little "Fat Tuesday" background for your reading pleasure!

- Mardi Gras is French for "Fat Tuesday". It is traditionally celebrated on Shrove Tuesday – or Pancake Tuesday, which falls on the day before Ash Wednesday.
- Historically, on this day, Christians would use up rich, fatty foods, such as meat, eggs and cheese, before the period of Lenten fasting. Many Christian congregations observe the day through the eating of pancakes, as well as the ringing of church bells, to remind people to repent of their sins before the start of Lent.

Living More Christ-like



"Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience." Colossians 3:12 NIV

We move into February—the month when we see Valentines everywhere and are reminded that this is the month we celebrate love. As I began this reflection, I almost turned to 1 Corinthians 13; one of the most well-know writings about love where Paul reminds the people of Corinth about the attributes of love. But Paul also wrote to the people of Colossae (and to you and I today) to remind Christians (that's us) that we are God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved by God. Paul writes Colossians to remind those who profess to be Christian that we should live in such a way that others see the difference God's love makes in our living. We should "clothe" ourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. Our Christian wardrobe is a statement that brings action to our professions of faith.

As 2024 moves into February, we have opportunities to make a difference in our communities through outreach and works that show the communities we live in that God leads us to servanthood that makes a difference. Making a difference isn't easy—it takes time and our willingness to show compassion, kindness, and patience often when we least feel like it. Compassion means we take time to see the people around us; to listen to another's story and really hear them—to honestly care. When we treat others with gentleness and kindness, we show them they matter. But we are called to be humble, gentle, and patient with God's creation too. In this month of considering love, let our focus be on the ways our living leads us to be more Christ-like to the people and to be more just in the way we treat the world around us.

Remember that Lent begins in February. Ash Wednesday is Valentine's Day. Our Ash Wednesday evening service is in Janesville this year. We begin at 7:15 p.m. Our weekly Lenten discussions will be based on Mike Slaughter's book, "Renegade Gospel; the Rebel Jesus." Our Parish Deaconess, Cindy Saufferer, will lead many of the Wednesday evening discussions. I will help when Cindy is out of town. I hope you'll consider joining us Wednesday evening at 7:15. The gatherings will rotate between our three parish churches. See the article in this newsletter about our Lenten Services.

"Down the Drain" Fund-Fundraiser



After 72 years of faithful service in clean-up from countless gatherings over food and fellowship, the drains for our BGUMC basement kitchen sinks have become compromised by a combination of tree roots, corrosion, and the make-up of drain supplies that were available back in 1951 (due to raw-material shortages impacted by wartime). We have now found a solution to make our BGUMC basement kitchen sink drains more functional. It will involve two individual pumps (one for each sink location) that will grind any small food particles that go into the dishwater and that will then push the water through interior piping that will carry it to join the water flow to the new septic system. It is hoped that the new kitchen sink drain system will be up and running by early March. The estimate for the entire job is about \$3,500. \$1,345 in free-will donations have already been given through the January Men's Breakfast. We need your help in raising the additional \$2,155 ASAP. If you would like to contribute toward this special project, please note "Down the Drain" on your check or offering envelope, and place your donation in the white "offering coffeepot" at the back of the sanctuary. Lent & Easter Mission Giving Opportunity February 14th through March 31st



Proceeds To Bethlehem Inn, Waseca

Our BGUMC Mission Team has become intrigued by the important work being done by the Bethlehem Inn, a faith-based organization in Waseca that provides short-term transitional housing for homeless women and children, as well as social service connections to empower these families to improve their lives and be able to journey toward a more stable future. We've been working to learn more about them through their website and mailings, contact with their staff, and also through Dick and Trudi's personal connections with the organization. The impact that they have on the lives of women and children is amazing.

- ◆ They are located at 400 2nd Ave NW, Waseca right across from Sacred Heart Catholic Church. The building once served as the residence hall for the nuns of Sacred Heart.
- Since opening in January of 2019, they have served 357 homeless women and children (190 women and 167 children). In 2023 they served 43 women and 32 children.
- Their goal: To assist women and children without permanent housing to find the resources necessary for housing and support services. All guests agree to an assessment prior to housing placement. Each guest also follows a standard of placement guidelines while at Bethlehem Inn.
- The overall operation of Bethlehem Inn is overseen by the Board of Directors working with a program director. The guests share in the responsibilities for the care of the house in cooperation with the director and staff of volunteers. Management by full-time and part time paid staff.


