
Men's Breakfast a Success

Our Easter Journey

*“¹ On the first day of the week, very early in the morning,
the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb.
² They found the stone rolled away from the tomb,
³ but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus.
” Luke 24: 1-3 NIV*

Soon, we celebrate our identity as Easter People! It is one of the two most-loved holidays in our Christian tradition. It is time to prepare, dear ones! If we aren't careful, we may find ourselves on the other side of Easter Sunday wondering how it passed so quickly—without us. 

Mmmm-mmmm-mmm! What a yummy smell making my tummy growl hungrily!! As one entered the church the delicious aroma of the dinner was so enticing that instantly your appetite perked up. All hands were on deck for the

Friday evening fish fry on March 18th. A fantastically choreographed crew consisting of fryers, transporters, servers, runners, to-go packagers, re-fillers, set-uppers, and clean-uppers happily rushed about completing their appointed tasks (and anything else that might pop up which needed to be done). Of course, that's because the choreography had been rehearsed through several previous fish fries; and when you're having fun "working" alongside your fellow parishioners it hardly feels like work, and things go smoothly.

From 5pm until 7pm the basement and parking lot were filled – and RE-filled again – with hungry friends and neighbors from the area and from afar. A carload of college Frat brothers of Michael's drove down from the cities just in support of our fish fry. Pastor Jan Redman made an appearance from Mankato. Several had seen the flyers posted at the Half Pint Brewery; others on Facebook. The majority were satisfied return "customers" from previous BGUMC fish fries. Happy banter, visiting, hugs, laughter and teasing was evident – and that just from the church crew!! Our hungry supporters were equally sharing in the visiting, reunion, and enjoyment of breaking bread together. Over 230 meals were served. At least 175 came through the basement doors for inside seating. The "assembly crew" for take-outs was working non-stop fulfilling orders. NO ONE was too old or too young to offer a hand. Yes, young Kaylee, aged 3 ½ years, took her job seriously as she helped with take out orders, our Junior H.S. and Senior H.S. youth were in the mix of helpers, and our adults well..... I won't mention ages here, but everybody gladly lent 2 hands.... and lickety-split feet when needed. The walleye was superb (this writer joked when someone inquired where we got all the fish from [Red Lake Indian Reservation] that it was an all-congregation fishing excursion; the inquisitor halfway believed it 'til I told her where we actually got it), and the side dishes and desserts rounded out a very satisfying and filling meal. And just like in Matthew's account of feeding the multitude, there were left-overs. The free-will offering garnered a profit of \$5,015.00 which will be used towards our warm, welcoming and beautiful new addition.


United Methodist Women is now United Women in Faith!

The move is part of a refreshing of the organization that includes a new logo and an array of new and improved programs to nurture current members and welcome new women to join to put their love in action on behalf of women, children, and youth. The organization announced the new operating name in March.

The new programs are fruits of research conducted over the past five years with more than 24,000 United Methodists and women of other Christian traditions participating in the surveys, focus groups and interviews. This input informed the prayerful discernment of staff and elected leaders. The changes are designed to address the different needs and life stages of current members and new women and expand options for membership and engagement. The new name also aims to welcome current members whose local churches may choose to disaffiliate from The United Methodist Church as well as women of other faith traditions who want to join.

“This is an exciting time for our organization!” said Harriett Jane Olson, CEO of United Women in Faith. “Looking back, we see the through lines for our organization—faith in God, love for each other and commitment to putting our faith into action supporting women, children, and youth. These commitments have been expressed in different ways at different times using different names, always calling women to world changing action. This combination of a new look, more accessible resources for members and new ways to participate, positions us for impact in our own journeys and in how we engage the world that God so loves.”

The organization remains incorporated in New York as United Methodist Women and is doing business as United Women in Faith.



AED at Blooming Grove UMC

Our sincere thanks go to Brad & Tracie Spinler for donating an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) to BGUMC, available now in the area of

the new addition and the back of the sanctuary. Per the Mayo Clinic Website:

AEDs can be used at home and in schools and are also found in a number of public places. These light-weight, portable devices are used to revive someone from sudden cardiac arrest. This usually occurs when a disruption in the heart's electrical activity causes a dangerously fast heartbeat (ventricular tachycardia) or a fast and irregular heartbeat (ventricular fibrillation). If someone is having one of these irregular heart rhythms, their heart doesn't pump effectively and may even stop. When this happens, the brain and other vital organs don't get the blood and oxygen they need, and a person can even die if they don't get treatment within minutes. The sooner the heart's normal rhythm is restored, the greater the chance that there won't be permanent damage to the brain and other organs. If a person is having ventricular fibrillation or ventricular tachycardia and an AED is nearby, a bystander in a public place or a family member can use it to jolt their heart back to a normal rhythm and possibly save their life.

March 2022 Update from the MN Conference of the United Methodist Church

General Conference further postponed to 2024

As the pandemic continues and the wait time for visas stretches to over two years in some countries, the Commission on the General Conference announced today that the 2020 General Conference cannot be held in 2022 due to COVID-related and governmental policies/constraints. The gathering will be postponed until 2024, and the Commission has already secured a venue for what would have been the regularly scheduled quadrennial event.

What the postponement means for us

In light of the postponement, we as the Minnesota Annual Conference will continue to engage in creating a post-pandemic church, living into our vision, and embodying our values. This means we are committed to creating a place at the table for everyone, including LGBTQIA+ persons, and to listening more deeply to voices that have often been marginalized. The Extended Cabinet has created a statement of our commitments that speaks specifically to how we hold the value of LGBTQIA+ inclusion in this waiting season. Regardless of the outcome of the next General Conference, we will be unwavering in our commitment to full inclusion and laser focused on furthering Jesus's ministry of extending abundant life to all of God's children. This extended liminal time does not change who we are as the Minnesota Annual Conference or who we are in Christ.


