Love Offering

The Love Offering provides the opportunity for all MN UMCs to work together to bring healing in the name and spirit of Jesus. This year's Love Offering will address the growing mental health needs in MN, as follows:

- 60% to a grant for MN Conference churches to begin or expand a mental health partnership project
- 30% to three MN nonprofits engaged in mental health education and advocacy: Mental Health Connect, Mental Health MN, and MN Association for Children's Mental Health
- 10 % each year goes to Volunteers in Mission scholarships, which support first-time mission trip participants

Personal Dignity Kits for Crisis Care



Each MN UMC is invited to make Personal Dignity Kits to send along with their representative to Annual Conference. These kits will then be delivered to the Midwest Distribution Center in Illinois, an organization founded/supported by the United Methodist Church. Their mission: to show God's love in a practical way to those in need. Supplies, including Personal Dignity Kits, are distributed freely in times of crisis through the organization's trusted partner non-profits throughout the US and the world, working with people from all places and backgrounds. In 2022, \$7.99 million of supplies were sent in 299 domestic and 48 international shipments. Supplies are prayed over multiple times while packed, and prayer cards are in each kit.

Now through May 18th: Collect & Deliver Supplies to BGUMC

Sign up for the materials (and amount) that you will donate on the list at the table in the SW corner of the sanctuary. Drop supplies off at the same table.

Items needed for each Dignity Kit:

- 1 hand towel – no kitchen towels
- 1 washcloth – no dishcloths
- 1 toothbrush – no multipacks, dental office logos, or toothpaste
- 1 bar soap – 3-4 oz.
- 1 shampoo – 12-19 oz.
- 1 deodorant – 2-3 oz. (stick, roll-on, or pump)
- Already 100% Covered: a \$2 cash donation per kit for razor & toothpaste (both added by Distribution Center at time of ship-out) and Freezer Strength resealable plastic bags for packing

To date, the generous hearts of BGUMC have already contributed enough supplies to head us toward 60 complete kits. Help us meet or exceed that number! Watch our Sunday bulletins for updates.

Growth



*The righteous will spring up like a palm tree.
They will grow strong like a cedar of Lebanon.
Those who have been replanted in the Lord's house
will spring up in the courtyards of our God.
They will bear fruit even when old and gray;
they will remain lush and fresh. Psalm 92:12-14*

As I share this May 2023 reflection, the day is chilly again and my soul is longing for warm Spring days—not two or three way above average kind of warm days—Spring warmth that entices the tulips and daffodils to send forth their blooms. So it is that I'm thinking of growth in this season of Spring.

Growth is a natural part of God's creation. Those who garden understand the cycle of planting, growing, and harvesting. (Those of us with perennial flower gardens lessen the work as the plants naturally grow after a rejuvenating winter sleep.) It seems I have a new appreciation for those plants that are abundantly fed by God's skilled Gardener's hands. We are surrounded by the beauty of God's work in Creation.

Do we see ourselves as a part of God's beautiful Creation or do we cringe in feelings of self-doubt and recrimination? As one who understands the darkness of self-doubt, it can be difficult to view oneself as God's beautiful handiwork. We have work to do but we have the perfect place to do the work—within the safety of the community of Christian fellowship. We can grow within the framework of Christ's church where we can find acceptance, compassion, and grace. In this year that we focus on our individual faith journeys, there are others in the community who understand our need to practice our Wesleyan grounded "means of grace." We have parish small group opportunities in our Bible Conversations at the Brewery (formerly Brew and Bible) and our bi-monthly Bible Studies at Cool Wave (in Waterville). Both are safe places where the conversations are rich and we offer one another a time to speak up and be heard. Being a part of the conversation helps us to grow in our Biblical understanding while we form friendships that sustain our journeys.

Another way we gather is in our summer joint worship opportunities. In June (Blooming Grove), July (Waterville), and August (Janesville), we will worship as one community with an opportunity for those who like to sing a time to gather prior to the service to be the "pop-up" choir for the service. Those Sundays will be the last in each respective month. These joint worship opportunities offer each a time to get to know others in our Prairie Lakes Parish community and a time to experience the Holy Spirit interwoven through the worship.

It is my hope that each of you knows how valued you are in your church and parish family—and by your Pastor. May we grow in love dear friends. Let it be so!

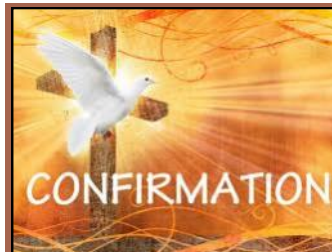

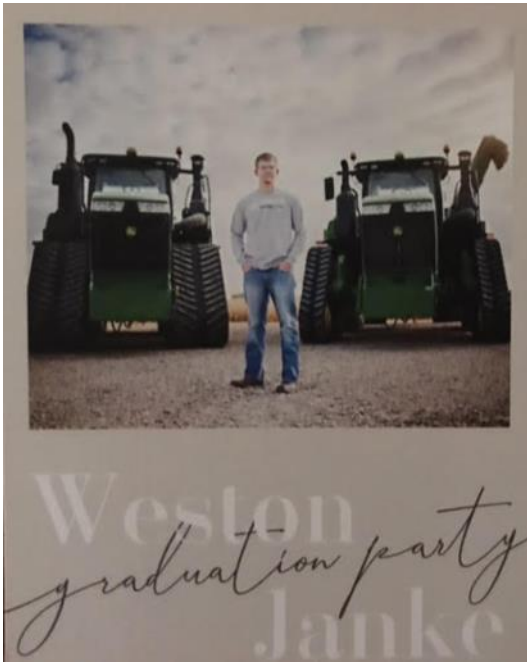

Financial Report:

Treasurer's Report: Gave \$800 to the Food Shelves. Patti moved to accept; Cindy seconded. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary's Report: Received \$407.80 for Emma Norton, \$250 for the Easter Breakfast (also goes to Emma Norton) Cindy asked about whether our giving trends have changed through covid.

Brian said things are pretty much on the same track as pre-covid.

Trustees Report:

Brad Saufferer reported that we spent \$500 to find out that the drain pipe in the kitchen is old and falling apart. The trustees will check with Dahle's about replacing the pipe from the outside, so we don't have to tear up the kitchen floor. Kirchner's will be fixing the south window with the trim/weather stripping issue. The sod by the road out by the cemetery was torn up by the grader. Brian will check with the township about paying for fixing it.

Another opportunity for Annual Conference is assembling Personal Dignity kits (formerly known as health kits). We will put this out to the congregation and Judy will take them along to Annual Conference. We'll spend the last day of Sunday School (May 21) having an intergenerational assembly party.

Education & Events:

- Confirmation will be May 7. We have two confirmands (Raelyn and Leighton).
- Patti will be collecting information on 3rd graders for Bibles (or others who haven't gotten one elsewhere), graduates, etc.

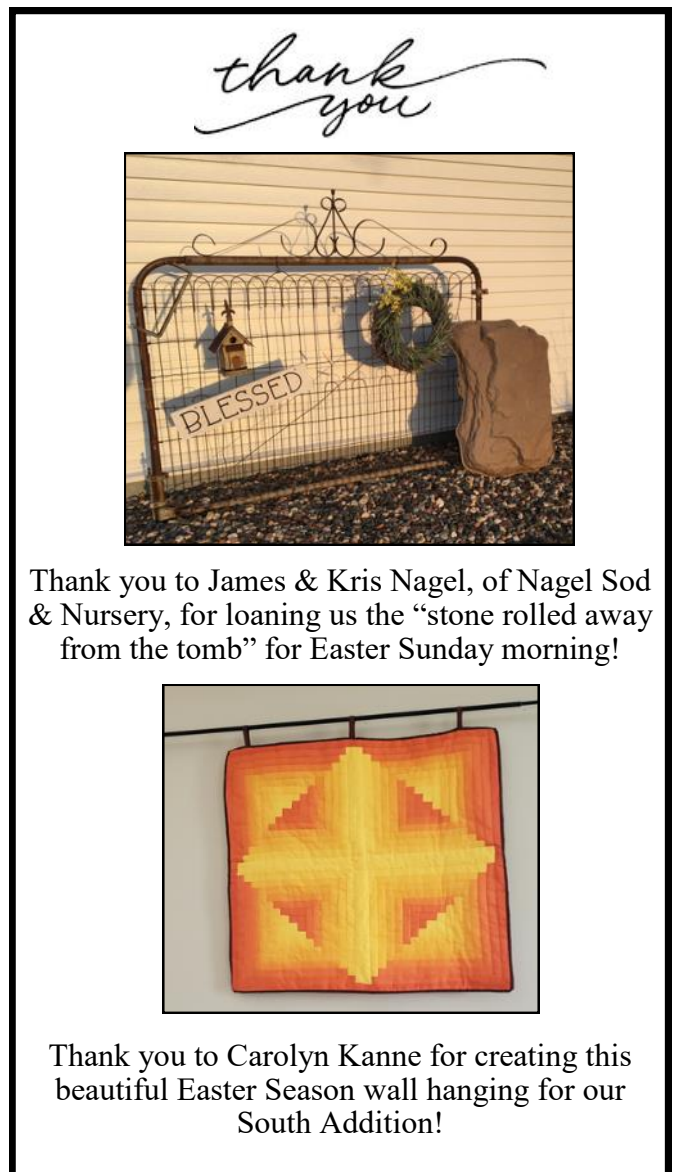
