
Second Sunday – Fun Day!! our intergenerational activity time




Intergenerational Pizza and **Movie Night** Thursday, December 30th 5:00 P.M.



If you were there in attendance, you sensed it; I've no doubt you felt it permeating every aspect of your being. God's love, God's grace, the Spirit's presence amongst us all. Holy. Joyful. Uplifting. Loving. Caring. Peaceful. Grace. Mercy. Breathe in; breathe out. Sunday, Dec. 12th, began with a host of contradictions and challenges surmounted. Our beautiful new entry and gathering place, floor freshly stained, wasn't ready for us to "gather" because a blizzard and unexpected work schedules of our volunteer workers prevented its completion by Sunday. But tippy-toeing in, we could still admire it's beauty. Our precious Pastor Kathy's mom, Dee, had her Home-going on 2 days prior – expected? Well, anticipated in the "soon," which suddenly was now. Our lay speaker (Cindy Saufferer—Deaconess), less than 24 hours previous, graciously accepted the pastoral responsibilities for the service. Sorrow and empathy for Kathy's (and family's) loss, yet also a bit of relief in that Dee's struggles are behind her and she was ready, as Kathy had recently shared with us. Prayerful thoughts of several other people, and events, on our minds. Inhale; exhale. Christmas program time, but.... Covid – Sunday School abbreviated. Rethink, re-plan. Let the Spirit guide.

As Cindy welcomed everyone, requesting our understanding and grace as our "flexibility" was called for, and as she glanced heavenward in a petition for God's hand on the wheel, already one could feel this was a sacred day. The sanctuary, quite full, (what a joy!) was lopsidedly heavy on the east side pews, but with so many of our congregation participating, yes "serving" during the service, the Chancel became wonderfully

lopsided, too. THREE generations of Nicholson family doing the Advent candles and readings.

Our 1st through 6th graders leading us in the responsive reading. Whoa! Yes, leading, with a maturity and apparent comfort up front of a full congregation. Voices still youthful, but smoothly, confidently reading, without fear of the mic. When did they become so grown up? What a true blessing to see them not just growing, but growing in the church. Everyone seems always to enjoy the adorable little ones. During Sunday School they'd admitted to their teacher about being "a little bit scared." But of course they're scared; they're 5 years old and in front of a crowd of people and supposed to DO STUFF and SING! And teacher had requested that they "just do your best." Deep breath; and let it out. A CD player can "skip" just like a scratched record can!?



Huh! Mechanical failure brought forth some unified laughter, easing the tension for the kids, perhaps, and a minor miracle somehow 'fixed' the CD. Christmas pageant in miniature – cows, ducks, a celebrating Mary and Joseph, amazed shepherds running to the stable, kings presenting their gifts to the baby - it was all in there and the kids were all "into" it. Their best? They knocked it out of the ball field! Oh, and their teacher had requested that the congregation listen to the singing with their hearts, not only their ears..... They Sang! THEY SANG OUT! AND THEY DID ACTIONS AS THEY SANG, TOO! Smiles spread from the congregation all the way around the church, including the "little bit scared" singers. When did THEY become so grown up?

We knew, of course, that Cindy would deliver a poignant message; but on a day's notice? Exploring "mercy," complete with amusing anecdotes from her own life, delving into its full meaning, her message touched the tender spots in us (in me). The homeless 'panhandler,' viewed with merciful eyes, is God's precious child, too. Les Misérables is a timeless classic, but how many times have I been truly, truly selflessly merciful? Breathe in; breathe out.... listen with my heart to what God's asking of me, helping me better understand the endless depth of God's mercy toward human, fallible, selfish me. Through Cindy, God delivered one heck of a sermon.

And then complete the whole experience with an unhurried time of fellowshipping with each other over cookies and punch. Such a full and filling service in spite of (or richer because of?) all the glitches. It was a



blessing. Every person, from the back pew to the front of the altar played a valuable part in the service. Whether or not you had a "part" per se, every one of us was necessary to make that worship service what it was. In all its imperfections, it was perfect. I commented to a friend, "How can such a tiny little church in the middle of the cornfields contain so **much**?" Later, as I thought of the cramped stable crowded with critters – and shepherds – I felt reassured thinking, "if the divine Spirit can be present there [crowded, "fragrant" stable], certainly it will be present here in this uplifted group of people now heading out our new doors and into our everyday lives; that Spirit supporting us as we move with mercy amongst our fellow man." I'll try to do my best. Knock it out of the ball field? I'll try to do my best. I believe there's a congregation from BGUMC trying just as hard.

Update RE BGUMC as Recipient of MN United Methodist Builders "Fall 2021 Call"

Right before Christmas, we received an exciting update from the MN United Methodist Builders group: They have received just over \$5,200 so far for the Blooming Grove UMC "Fall 2021 Builders Call"! They will do more promoting after the first of the year and continue to take in donations for our BGUMC South Addition Project from their supporters until March 30th.

BGUMC is grateful to have been selected as a recipient of this organization's mission giving. MN UM Builders is a group of hundreds of individuals and churches throughout Minnesota who join together each year to assist churches in their building projects. Their mission is to help MN UMCs connect with their community and welcome new people. Their goal: to assist churches in need of financial support for their building, remodel, or expansion projects. By providing support for the building projects of churches, it allows the churches to grow current ministries or build new ministries to made disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

Each year, the MN UMC Builders chooses to support the building projects of two churches across Minnesota - one in the Fall and one in the Spring. The "Fall 2021 Call", for which we've been chosen, runs for 6 months, from October through March, during which time the individuals/churches in this group learn of our story, and our building project, and make donations directly to the MN UM Builders. At the end of the "Call" (early April) BGUMC will receive a check for the total amount donated. Past "Call Recipients" have received anywhere from \$4,000 to \$7,000 in donations at the end of the 6-month time-frame.

From October through March, the MN UM Builders group has the opportunity to learn more about BGUMC through their "Fall 2021 Call" brochure, our Facebook page, our website, our newsletter, and perhaps even by joining us during Sunday morning worship. Their members are invited to donate as their hearts are called to do so.

Upon the conclusion of the "Fall 2021 Call", we at BGUMC are invited to become part of the MN UM Builders group, in the timeframe that we are able, to help other churches in the future. Copies of the MN UMC Builders brochure, "Fall 2021 Call - Blooming Grove United Methodist", are available on the table in the south bell tower - so that we can learn more of the work that they do. Johnson Co. in Waseca where she worked for 25 years, retiring in August of 1998. On November 19, 1998, Dee took a part time job at Janesville City Hall as the Utility Billing Clerk and retired on February 13, 2015, at the age of 79. She was a member of St. Ann Catholic Church in Janesville.

Dee is survived by her daughters: **Katherine** (Jerry) King and Kari (Darrell) Grisim; six grandsons: Patrick Radunz, Clint (Julie) King, Jeremy (Tiffany Dawson) King, Aaron (Trista) King, Kenny (Holly) Grisim, and Joshua (Angela) Radunz; three granddaughters: Kellie Jo (Jared) Anderson, Kristal (Andrew) Edwards, and Julie Radunz; 22 great grandchildren; and two great-great grandchildren; daughterin-law: Shawna Thielbar; brother, Richard (Arliss) Stenger; sister, Rosemary Neseth; 56 nieces and nephews and their families.
