- Kids' and adult sizes of warm socks, winter hats, gloves/mittens, and snow boots.



Its design and services are unique nationally, and provide amazing empowerment opportunities for all who enter its doors.



Sign up from September 14th – October 5th

Come and be part of a BGUMC Team that works together in the high-energy setting of the annual Owatonna Area Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) Food Pack on November 6th! If you wish to volunteer, please sign up at the table at the back of the sanctuary (under the bulletin board) between the Sundays of September 14th – October 5th. Because volunteer spots fill up super-fast, we want to be ready to enter our team as soon as registrations open in early October. More details will be provided as we learn more from the event organizers.

At this event, kids and adults of all ages work together to hand-pack **nutritious Manna-Pack®** Rice meals specifically designed to assist in reversing and preventing undernutrition, with each meal costing less than 30 cents. Note: There are also "seated volunteer" positions available – placing labels on rice bags waiting to be packed.

FMSC, a Christian nonprofit organization, partners with organizations around the world to reach undernourished children. They donate meals, free of cost, to an exceptional network of schools, orphanages, medical clinics, and feeding programs in 70 countries around the world – helping to deliver hope, and break the cycle of poverty. Eating just one of these meals a day can save a child's life.

A BGUMC Celebration of Tractors!

In our rural community, tractors are an integral part of our rich heritage, representing ingenuity, tenacity, hard work, hope, optimism in the face of all odds, and community. What better way to celebrate them, and all who have farmed with them over the years, than with a farm stock tractor pull at BGUMC!



Our "pulling afternoon" on Saturday, September 6th included 18 drivers hailing from 8 different towns, 24 tractors comprised of 6 different tractor makes, 12 pulling classes, and 39 individual hooks.

The most famous participant: Delilah, the pulling sled!

Onlookers gathered on the church lawn to watch, and eat lunch, under alternating brilliant blue skies, and cloud cover, with the big downpour waiting to let loose until the last serving table was being put away.

It was a great time of being together in community, and in the process, raising \$747 to go toward our BGUMC Accessibility Project.

It takes a village to coordinate a tractor pull! A huge thank you goes to all involved, including the people coordinating the weigh-ins, the person running Delilah – the pull sled, those handling the "hooks", flaggers, announcers, statisticians, and the persons providing and serving lunch.



As each tractor made its run that day, in your mind's eye, couldn't you just hear – and see - the Farmall baling hay in 1960 on a hot July afternoon, or the John Deere coming down the road in the fall of 1970 to help a neighbor with silo filling, or the guys making the last run with a 2-row corn picker with lights on in the darkness of October, or the men making their final attempt to finish plowing after the evening milking was done in the cold of November? We treasure the tractors, and those who ran them!

<u>Planning Ahead - Pleasant Grove Pizza Farm Information</u>

(Because our Prairie Lakes Parish has made a group reservation, individual reservations are not needed.)

Information from the Pizza Farm's Facebook page/website:

- Bring your own seating and a portable table (if desired).
- If you plan to stay for pizza lunch, pack a cooler with items such as the following: beverages, any other food you wish to enjoy with your pizza, plates, cups, utensils, napkins, and a trash bag to pack out your garbage when you leave.
- A hand washing station is provided. Although hand sanitizer will be provided at the ordering stations, please also bring your own.
- No pets allowed.
- 9 main pizzas and a weekly feature are offered. Check out their website for the detailed menu at <u>pleasantgrovepizzafarm.com</u>). Pizza prices range from \$23-\$27. They take credit cards and cash. One pizza feeds about 2-3 people as they are 14" hand rolled. They do not take pre-orders over the phone.

Directions to Pizza Farm from Blooming Grove UMC:



Historian's Note:

On any given Sunday or religious holiday, someone driving past churches big or small may hear the beautiful and sometimes somber tones of the church bell. Well, here at Blooming Grove, we're no different. Those who were in church on Sunday September 7, 2025, may have seen a rare sight. For about a half hour after church was over, the bell was visible to those who stood in the bell tower. It turns out Matt Mullenbach was oiling the bell, which is something I and many others have never really thought about. While he was in the tower, he was kind enough to take some pictures, some of which I have included here. This brings me to my next thought: how long has that bell been in the tower and what happened to the bell which was in the Bethel tower?



Weirdly enough, only a few months ago, my dad, Brian Kanne, rediscovered an envelope that had been sent to him from an extended family member back in 2015. This envelope contained the original receipt, found in a crack in the back of Ferdinand Kanne's desk, of the Immanuel bell from June 9, 1900. The receipt reads:


St. Louis Mo., June 9 1900
Received from Mr. F.G. Kanne
Three hundred fifty-eight 83/100 Dollars
Part freight bills the bal. cash being
payment in full for the bell and hanging
for M.E. Church Blooming Grove Minn
Stuckstede & Bro

*Fun fact: \$358.83 is approximately \$13,840 in 2025 (adjusted for inflation)

As for the bell that resided in the Bethel Tower; this was written in the July 1991 Visitor for the 40th anniver-

sary of the 1951 merger: "The bell from Bethel was sold to Dr. Edwin A. Schwendemann from Atlantic, Iowa to be used in a chime set." We don't actively know what happened to this "chime set," or any bells from it, after his death in 1973; but an assumption can be made that it is still in Iowa.

So next time you hear the bell chime on Sunday morning, you can now appreciate the beautiful, tonal sounds of the bell residing in Immanuel tower.
